Call to order/Roll call

Resource Review Chris Grieshaber	Funding Requests Band The U-High band is in the initial process of raising \$20,000 for band equipment, instruments and props for future marching band competitions. The primary, and initial focus, is to replace broken instruments and equipment. A few examples of this are cracks in cymbals, holes in the bass drum, dented/broken tuba for concert choir, and snare drum harnesses that slip causing issues for the performers (we've repeatedly tried to "Fix" these over the last couple of years and they are on last legs). In speaking to Mr. Landes, he spent time last year researching a convertible tuba that could be used both for concert band and marching band. A "basic" starter version was \$5,000. As you can see, costs add up quickly! There are approximately 75-100 students in band

Our request from Boosters is for \$500 intended on purchasing one of the 3-4 harnesses needed for the percussion. Mr. Landes directed us to work with the students and Sara (ISU percussion student teacher) to review and find a suitable harness that would give students support they need, and also be sturdy enough to last multiple years. He believes the current harnesses were purchased roughly 10 years ago through a parent donation. A good quality harness will cost approximately \$400 - \$500. With the Booster support we could purchase at least one harness and have some money left for part of a second purchase.

The following are strategies we have employed or are hoping to employ over the next 6 months:

- 1) Individual donations matching gifts through employers
- 2) Grants for volunteer work
- 3) Dine to donate starting with Krispy Kreme the week of 10/16
- 4) 50/50 raffle and concessions at various Uhigh/ISU events
- 5) Kids want to help with bake sales, tshirt sales, etc.
- 6) A formal campaign targeting current band families and all alumni band members. We are in initial discussions with the ISU Foundation. We have a site, which appears to be very similar to the SnapRaise site we discussed at the last Booster meeting. Our hope is to potentially use this to put together a formal campaign.

To date the band has raised about \$7,000

Angela Null made a motion for \$1,000 to go towards this request for harnesses and instrument repair. Jennifer McCarron seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

• Basketball (Boys and Girls)

The boys and girls basketball program have purchased a Dr. Dish shooting machine from Illinois Wesleyan University for \$2,700. The shooting machine allows for our basketball players to get shots up in an efficient manner that doesn't require a rebounder or a passer. The machine collects shots and funnels them into a machine that will pass to the players. This allows our players to get shots up in an easy and efficient manner. A player could get 500 shots up in 20-25 minutes, where without the Dr. Dish it could take up to 90 minutes to get 500 shot attempts. This is a huge advantage to our program; we have purchased one 7 or 8 years ago and it has held up really well. This is a second Dr. Dish which will allow both the boys and girls programs in and out of season to efficiently work on their shot and drastically improve. By adding a 2nd Dr. Dish we will be able to serve more of our student athletes at the same time and make practice time more efficient as well. Within certain PE classes U-High Students are able to get the Dr. Dish out and get a work-out in as well. The Dr. Dish Shooting Machine is used year round by U-High Student Athletes in the boys and girls programs. A brand new Dr. Dish is over \$5,000 and we got a great deal on this one because of our relationship with the IWU coaches. They purchased a new one and were willing to give us a great deal on the 2nd one for us. Other schools in our town and conference have 3-4 Dr. Dishes, this is not viewed by our programs as a want, it is viewed as a need to remain competitive.

60+ U-High Students are impacted by this request each year. We anticipate this current Dr. Dish will work without issues for a minimum of 5-7 years and then small maintenance will need to be done.

The boys and girls are requesting reimbursement from Boosters for the \$2,700 purchase of the Dr. Dish from Illinois Wesleyan University. We have already paid for the Dr. Dish and it has arrived and our players have been using it. We are requesting that Boosters cover 100% of the purchase due to the importance that it serves both of our programs. The Boys and Girls programs split the cost equally at \$1,350 a program. If boosters is not able to cover 100% of the cost, the boys and girls in the basketball programs would greatly appreciate any help that boosters is able and willing to give. The last request that boys basketball has made from boosters was nearly 7 years ago and I believe that boosters covered half of the cost of our original Dr. Dish Shooting Machine, since our programs do not make many, if any, requests from boosters we hope that is taken into consideration when we do make a request.

The Basketball programs at U-High fundraise through our Summer Basketball Camps and this year we will be doing a Free-Throw-A-Thon fundraiser during the Winter Season.

Girls basketball received \$500 for uniforms last year. The Boosters guideline has been \$500 evert two years for each group requests.

Megan Brent made motion to give \$1,500 towards this basketball shooting machine. Eric Thome made a second. The motion passed unanimously.

Administration Report (Andrea Markert - Principal)

- We are in the winter sports season now. Had such success during the Fall sports. Girls basketball starts next week.
- There is an opening in the main office. Hoping to hire someone by the end of the week.
- Met with architects for Chemistry lab. We raised \$300,000 and the district will cover remainder. Construction will start day after school is over and be done by July 31. First will do asbestos abatement. This lab is from the 1960s.
- Design Lab meet next on Monday. We should have info this week about the number of groups we will have. Alumni will help with this.
- Giving Tuesday, November 28. Trying to get a new John Deere gator. This is used for sports and other PE classes.
- Incidences of swatting. If students are in danger, parents will be notified. While Bloomington and Unit 5 were targeted in a recent incident, U-High was not named as a target. Please don't perpetuate rumors regarding things that happen at school. Consider that perpetuating rumors especially about children is not helpful.
- Emails regarding Healthy Roster Account are being sent out via email saying sign up is required. Mr. Evans will send out info on Skyward saying that it is not required. There is an option to opt ouout. Mr. Evans will send an email to opt out.
- Current Covid cases are not a concern right now.
