Call to order/Roll call

VP Liz Kinsella	Nothing to report.
Secretary Angie Reedy	The minutes from February are on the Boosters website and need to be approved. Shannon Moreland motioned to approve the minutes. Liz Kinsella seconded the motion.
Treasurer Shannon Moreland	 During February we received just under \$1000 in Spiritwear income from online sales and we also paid our annual insurance premiums. During March, expenses included \$200 paid to Gold Rush winners and just over \$100 in administration expenses (stop pay fee on a lost check, stamps for mailings, filing fees for our Illinois registration). In addition, as noted in our ISU foundation account section, we had additional winners who asked that their Gold Rush winnings be transferred to various clubs and teams. Resource Review Chris Grieshaber Matthias Pope	 Boys Golf Request – Chris Headrick (coach) Mrs. Markert gave context before discussions started to remind everyone that the golf team uses the ISU golf course. Because U-High now must pay for each practice (2 separate charges, JV/Varsity), more allocated money for the Golf team must go towards covering their practice facility. Mr. Headrick came to describe how the Golf team is raising money for a new launch monitor. This launch monitor is the Uneekor Eye Mini. Launch monitors are used on the practice range to provide helpful data to golfers. The particular launch monitor provides data on carry distance, swing speed, ball speed, along with 16 other data points including a built in camera system to allow golfers to get a view of their club and ball at impact. The current launch monitor we have is about 5 years old and requires a battery pack to be used on the range. It's more cumbersome to setup and not as accurate as this new option. to This new launch monitor

is one of the most accurate launch monitors on the market. In addition to this it is easier to setup and would allow golfers to create "profiles" so that their data can be stored and compared throughout their years at U-High. This monitor should last for about 8-9 years.
The Golf team hasn't asked for a grant for several years. Could possibly share with the girl's team. There are 20 students on the boy's Golf team.
Discounted cost of the launch monitor for the team is \$3,396.51. Requesting \$1,700 from Boosters (50%). The team has raised the other half.
Angela Null motioned to give \$1,700 to the boys Golf team for the launch monitor. Matthias Pope seconded. Motion unanimously passed.

Administration Report (Andrea Markert – Principal)

Hired Brian Rohman has been hired as the permanent Asst. Principal.

U-High has hired a new Social Science teacher. Mr. Dearing is retiring, and we will be looking for a new engineering teacher.

Facilities: Library tables are all here! Chemistry lab renovation will begin at the end of this school year. Related to the lab renovation, the Main office will need to close and will relocate to library for part of summer. Chem lab should be done 8/1. Also, new bleachers are coming this summer. U-High received a grant which covered half of bleacher cost. In addition, the school raised enough money to add water fountain outside.

Many things will be happening within the next month including ACT testing, After Prom/Prom, EOY concerts, AP testing (566 AP tests will be given to students).

Admissions info: Letters go out 4/15. In addition to admitting freshmen, we will have a few upper class admissions. For the freshman class, U-High will accept 160 students -50 from Metcalf, >30 siblings, leaving half of the spots for other applicants. Many great applications. More applications from people who have lived abroad. Good diversity of candidates. 325 applications. Usual number of applicants is 280-300.

Mrs. Markert attended a College of Education Next Gen Education event in Arizona. Locally, she and four students attended a Springfield event and talked with Senators.

U-High is not included as a recipient of the 1% sales tax which was just approved. These funds are going to McLean county public schools.
