

- Would the admissions committee consider my race in the admissions decision?
  - No. Students are admitted to U-High without regard to race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, order of protection, gender identity and expression, age, marital status, disability, genetic information, veteran/military status.
  - Names and other identity markers are removed from application materials prior to the committee's review.

#### Can I mention my race in my response to the prompt?

 Yes, you can do so if you choose. The Supreme Court noted in the recent decision, Students for Fair Admission Inc. v. President and Fellows of Harvard College and University of North Carolina (143 S.Ct. 2141), that an applicant can discuss "how race affected his or her life, be it through discrimination, inspiration or otherwise."

The admissions committee views applicants based on their experiences as individuals.
