



Dr. Charles Dunn served as chair of the United States J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board from 1988 until 1993, an unprecedented four terms. The board governs the world's largest and most prestigious international exchange program with 200,000 alumni in 150 countries.

Dr. Dunn has served as an administrative and legislative assistant to members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, as well as to the governor of Washington State. Before joining the Clemson faculty in 1972 Dunn was a member of the faculties at Florida State University and the University of Illinois. He received the Michelin Award for Excellence in Teaching at Clemson in 1994. Additional honors include the Award for Outstanding Service from the U.S. Information Agency and listings in *Who's Who in International Education* and *Who's Who in American Politics*.

As a U-High student, Dr. Dunn received the David Gibson Award and delivered the 1970 commencement address. Dr. Dunn has authored a new book, *Morality and the Modern Presidency*, which will be distributed this year.
