- Going to keep with in person meetings for as long as we can
- Great Fall Activates and Fundraising have been accomplished. Take a minute to review the notes from September and October meetings to get caught up!
- We are welcoming a guest each meeting. Last meeting Wilma Bates joined us from the ISU
 Foundation to share about giving and how financial sponsorship works with ISU and U High
- Today we have Dr. Robert Fitzgerald to share on two topics first the upcoming trip to the
 <u>Ali Center</u> and also to share from his unique perspective, tips on transitioning to high
 school.

Dr. Fitz is in his 21st year of teaching at U-High, but his connection with the school goes beyond that from his time at Metcalf and graduating from U-High in 1992. His family is also very involved with the Lab schools. Several years ago, he was a Fulbright scholar in London and in a round about way this led him to become aware of and connected to the Muhammed Ali Center where 44 students and 4 faculty members will be going this week.

The experience with the students centers around the six core principles of the Ali Center. In 2019 U-High participated in the first conference and created the value statement which is seen around the school. Students this year will build on that value statement for ways to put the values into practice. Thank you again to the Boosters for the generous funding to enable this trip to happen.

The second topic Dr. Fitz spoke on was his **3 Tips for Transitioning to High School**.

1. Think about what it means to send your kids to a lab school. Don't expect it to be the same as the public school they would have attended or private school they came from.

	 Allow them to be taught, challenged, and expected to think critically. Allow them to be coached and to be put into adverse situations that require them to grow and mature. Don't make their experiences here only about them as they were and are, but rather about what/who they might become. See to it that they are who they said they would be when they applied. Encourage them to see the value - for themselves and for us - in not specializing in one thing and becoming a more well-rounded person while here. Don't buy into the idea that their future only depends on excellence in one area of interest or one skill.

Secretary Angie Reedy	 The October meeting minutes were not yet posted online so can't be approved yet. Next month, we will need to approve the October and November meeting minutes. Also meeting dates aren't being posted on the U-High calendar so let's try to get those included as well. Please state your name when you are motioning to approve. Treasurer Shannon Moreland	 Gold Rush income – we continued to receive a small number of tickets purchased. \$200 added this month, which brings us to just under \$9500 so far this school year. We are about \$1200 short of where we stood at this point last year. Spirit Wear Income - \$1500 in sales this month, and our year-to-date income of \$9,300 is \$5000 more than our income from spirit wear last year. However, we have also purchased more stock. Spirit Wear Expenses - Paid invoices of almost \$11,000 in October for orders in the early part of the school year. Have spent \$5,500 more than last year. Gold Rush Expenses – Some of the late September drawings were paid in October. In addition, a few winners have returned the funds to Boosters. So far this year, we are \$100 less than last year. The funds noted in the ISU foundation account includes a few continued donations minus the 2
	 \$500 requests approved at the September meeting and transferred in October. This balance does NOT yet include the deductions for the funds approved at the last Booster meeting (Diversity Trip and Student Senate). Working with Stacey Welter on how that will be used/transferred. That is \$4000 that will be deducted in future report(s). We are working towards a budget view at the end of this year to develop a process to help us plan for the future.

- Curriculum is more rigorous here, but we have individualized opportunities for students who need individual support, Also believe students rise to the occasion.
- Kids don't fall through the cracks because staff meets with kids to help not fail. They can do that because of smaller size.
