Secretary Angie Reedy	The December meeting minutes were posted online. Shannon Moreland motioned to approve the minutes and Angela Null seconded the motion.								
Treasurer	Full report is attached at the end of these minutes.								

Shannon For December and January we had about \$1,000 sales in spirit wear. Some of these went to Moreland **Homecoming Social** \$8,000 has come in for Cash Bash, but payment for the event still needs to be made \$750 Gold Rush Paid \$500 in Wrestling funding request and \$2,000 donation was added to the foundation account but it will be used for After Prom. The past couple of years have not been "normal," so trying to build a budget based on what has been spent. Hopefully will get to propose a budget that can be used for next year. Any Request Boys and Girls Cross Country (Jill Burroughs) Need funds to purchase two replacement hurdles for Funding? also a massage gun to help relieve aches and pains for runners, and third to purchase bibs for Jennifer races. Last time that XC asked for funds was for uniforms several years ago. There are 75 McDade students involved with boys and girls cross country. As for the team's efforts to raise funds, the Chris students do a Run a Thon and families request State Farm grants. Families also offer flat Grieshaber donations. The teams would like to participate in the Dine to Donate perhaps in the summer or fall. The team's season starts with summer running in June and lasts through November. Cross country parents are very supportive and would be available to work at Boosters events, There's also a possible opportunity to work at ISU concessions, Total amount cross country is asking for is \$500. (Because the request was not received early enough, it will be voted on for approval next month.) Boys and Girls Swimming and Diving (Michelle Meyer) The swim team needed to purchase a replacement laptop to submit meet entries and run meets. It was needed asap due to meets they are hosting. Also purchased a record board header because the previous one was brittle and falling apart. 23 student swimmers participate from U-High. The computer is used constantly throughout the season. The record board header is on the wall at Horton pool. Laptop is \$661.44 (lifespan 6-7 years), asking for total amount. Record board header \$135 (15+ years), asking for total amount. (The main part of the record board has been funded by a donation last March.) The new record board will last for another 15-20 years. Total amount requested is \$796.44. Shannon Moreland motioned to approve giving the swim teams this amount. Erin Easter seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Administration Report (Andrea Markert – Principal)

- Alumni association is reinventing itself. The U-High Alumni Association is refocusing on 4 areas: 1. Communication, social media savvy to push out all the things Boosters and U-High are doing; 2. Service, Wants to be of service to the school. Potential areas of service include: internships, looking for people to work for their companies, speakers to come into classroom, mentoring, tutoring, volunteering at events like After Prom, 3. Events, They will be creating a Homecoming event that is different. On Homecoming, they would like to bring in alumni on a smaller group level rather than the assembly, 4. Fundraising, maybe a scholarship or an amount to give to the school each year.
- **Prospective Student Open House** Very well attended, Applications are coming in and shadowing is happening, Essays are now called "prompts" and can now be typed. Discipline reports are not required anymore. Once students are admitted, their discipline reports will still be requested with the transcript. There were efforts to increase diversity, and these will continue.
- **Student Diversity Committee** is working on training in Restorative Practices this Friday. About 40 students will participate in the training.
