- Boys and Girls Cross Country (Jill Burroughs) (This is the request as communicated last month: Boys and Girls Cross Country need funds to purchase two replacement hurdles also a massage gun to help relieve aches and pains for runners, and third to purchase bibs for races. Last time that XC asked for funds was for uniforms several years ago. There are 75 students involved with boys and girls cross country. As for the team's efforts to raise funds, the students do a Run a Thon and families request State Farm grants. Families also offer flat donations. The teams would like to participate in the Dine to Donate perhaps in the summer or fall. The team's season starts with summer running in June and lasts through November. Cross country parents are very supportive and would be available to work at Boosters events, There's also a possible opportunity to work at ISU concessions, Total amount cross country is asking for is \$500.)

# Counseling Center Updates

- NCAA is removing their standardized test score requirement for 2023 enrollees and beyond.
  - NCAA <u>Divisions I</u> and <u>II</u> adopted legislation to remove standardized test scores from initial-eligibility requirements for student-athletes who initially enroll full time on or after August 1, 2023.

- Rural Rural Health Careers Camp- The Rural Health Careers Camp is a three-day, overnight educational program for high school students interested in the healthcare field. Students will participate in hands-on learning activities and labs that represent different healthcare careers and stay at an overnight facility to experience living on a college campus. Some of the healthcare careers already scheduled are: medicine, nursing, social work, dentistry, physical therapy, occupational therapy, medical lab sciences, and many more!

- Please see the below Testing Dates for Spring 2023. More information will be sent out closer to the date of each Test below, but for now please be sure to mark applicable dates on your calendar.
- March 10<sup>th</sup> (Friday)-Illinois Science Assessment -all Juniors will test in Stroud Auditorium
  - \*\*\*\*The state is now requiring current U-High Juniors to take the Illinois
     Science Assessment. This is a state mandated test that we are administering all
     in one morning on Friday, March 10th in Stroud Auditorium. Testing will start
     at 8:00 and students should be done by 11:00. Students will be released upon
     completion of the assessment so some students may finish by 10:30 whereas
     others may not finish until 11:00.
  - The results of this assessment are used to help the Illinois State Board of Education identify local successes in implementing the Illinois Learning Standards for Science. Students' individual results are not shared and the sole purpose of this assessment is to provide Educators and Administrators with additional data to inform broad curriculum adjustments over time to ensure that all students are being prepared for college and careers, including in the high-demand science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields.
  - As a result, ALL Juniors need to report to Stroud Auditorium on Friday, March 10th with their FULLY CHARGED laptop prepared to start the assessment at 8:00.
  - Thanks for your cooperation in helping our students meet this mandate.

#### **New Business**

- Booster's tax filings. Wilma Bates shared at the beginning of the year about the ISU foundation and it's roll with U-High Boosters. We are now familiar with how the Foundation operates. In 2010 ISU accounting said that if Boosters would kept our own accounts we needed to be a tax entity. If we want to use ISU umbrella, would need to run all expenses and payment through ISU accounting. At that time U-High Boosters obtained atax id number, but has not filed returns. We desire to make sure Boosters is in compliance.
- Two Options:
  - First Option: Go through ISU accounting using their accounts, would have to relinquish our own Boosters accounts which raises questions such as: "What does this to a raffle?" Cash Bash?, After Prom expenses...
  - Second Option: Reestablish tax-exempt status and take care of own tax return. Large donations may still be given through the ISU Foundation.
- Next Steps: Talk with Andrea and Stacy Welter, meet with ISU foundation, ISU Accounting, Talk with IRS
  - Understand what is available to us, what would have to change, maybe the changes are okay.
- Discussion: the ISU foundation grant and donations are distributing accurately. We don't want to change relationship with Foundation. We already have our own accounts but need to determine if we want these to go through ISU accounting or continue our own accounting. We want to continue to make it easy for parents to donate and get the matching grants. Consider if we go under ISU accounting would we be able to do the things we want to do. Alternatively, perhaps we should acknowledge that ISU currently handles other U-High accounts/reimbursements and could they just add handling the Boosters accounting? We desire to be responsible not necessarily autonomous.
